Mary Pattillo is the Harold Washington Professor of Sociology and African American Studies, and Chair of the African American Studies Department, at Northwestern University. Her areas of research include race and inequality, housing, urban politics, education reform, criminal legal studies, and stratification within the Black community. She is the author of two award-winning books – *Black Picket Fences: Privilege and Peril among the Black Middle Class* (University of Chicago Press, 1999) and *Black on the Block: The Politics of Race and Class in the City* (University of Chicago Press, 2007) – that focus on class stratification, public housing, education, crime, urban planning, community organizing, and youth culture in African American neighborhoods in Chicago. She is co-editor of *Imprisoning America: The Social Effects of Mass Incarceration* (Russell Sage, 2004). Pattillo is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and the American Academy of Political & Social Science, and sits on the Board of Trustees of the W.T. Grant Foundation and Chicago Appleseed Center for Fair Courts. Pattillo holds a BA in Urban Studies from Columbia University and an MA and PhD in Sociology from the University of Chicago.
